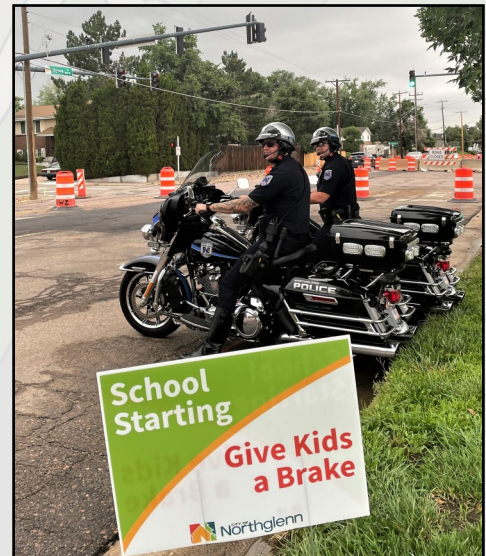

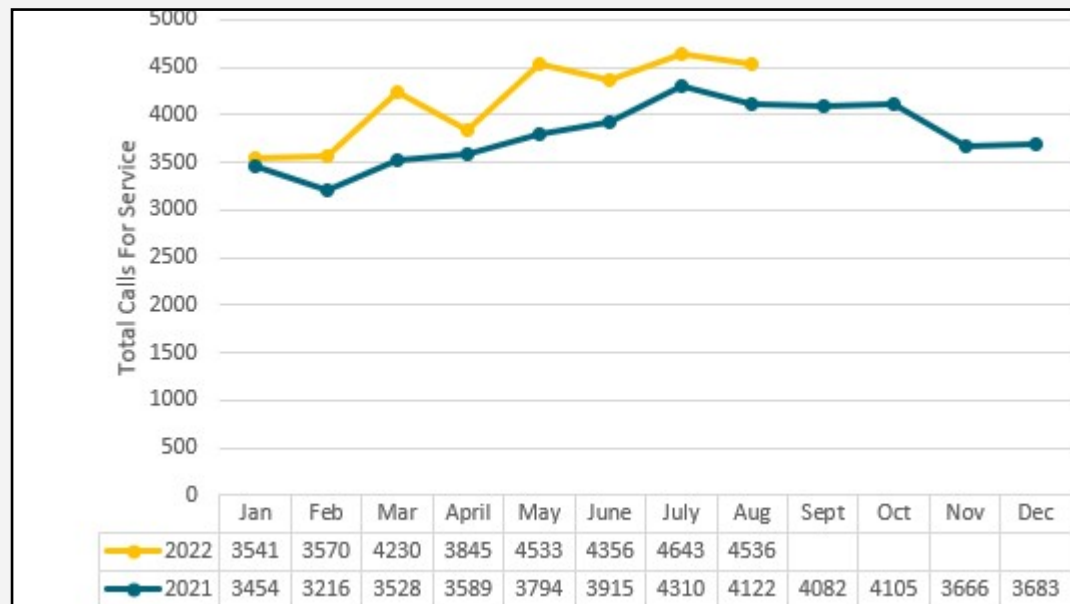

Persons Experiencing Homelessness Data

Crisis Response Unit Update:

The Winter Housing Program is closing on 8/31. The WHP has averted 3,339 nights of homelessness. 19 of the 73 full time participants have exited into housing. A full report will be available by the end of September.

In the Month of August, CRU responded to:


- 89 Crisis Calls
- Accepted 20 referrals from PD
- Accepted 3 referrals from Neighborhood Services
- Accepted 2 referrals from Municipal Court
- Responded 119 times to clients from PD, Code, and the Court

Friday Office Hours have been averaging 25 clients during the hours of 9-12 on Fridays.
