- Assisted with the funeral procession for Deputy Cliff Brooks from ACSO.



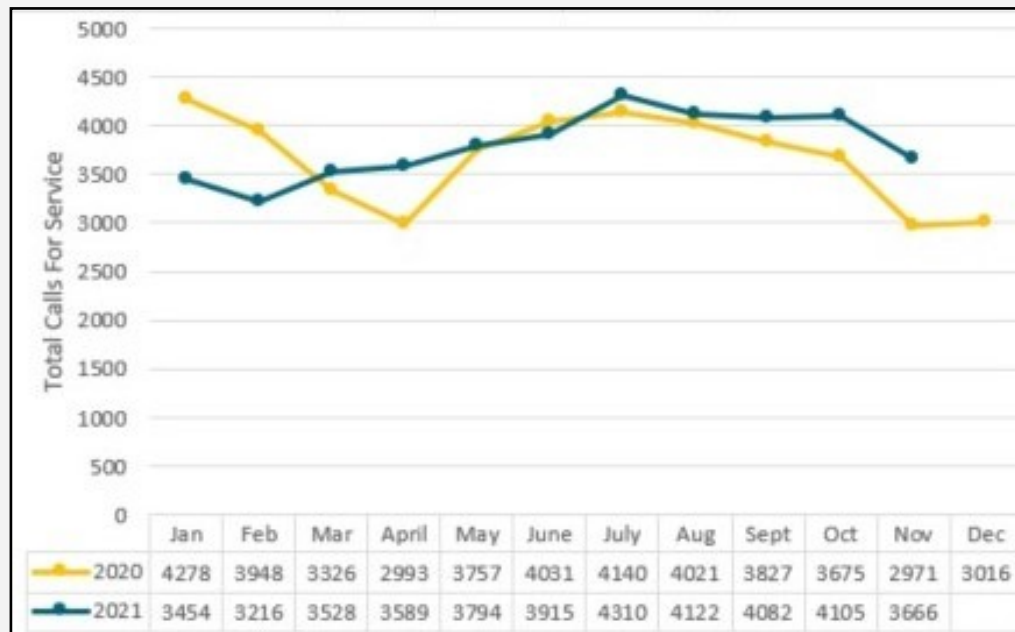

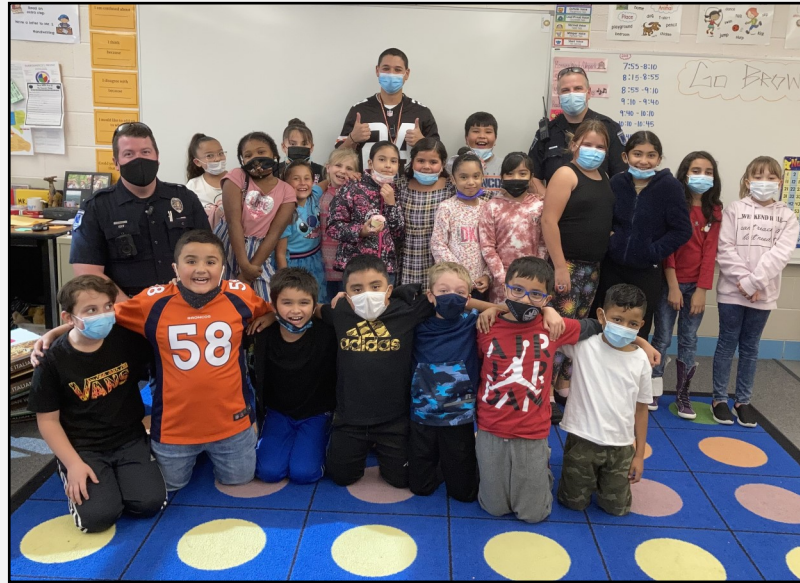

Thank you Hillcrest Elementary

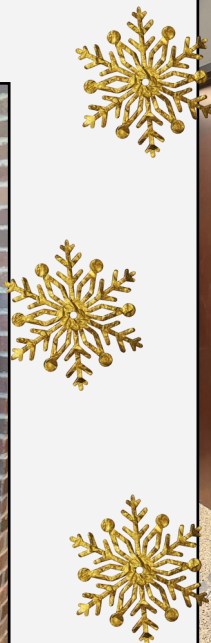

CPAAAN member, Margo Bilsborrow, gathered the troops to help decorate the Justice Center lobby for the Holidays.



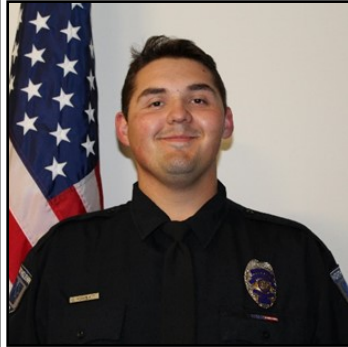

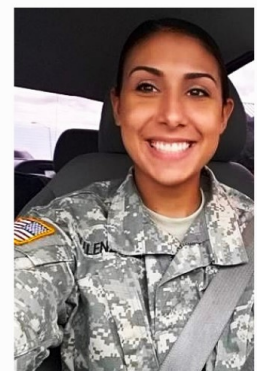

Pressing Concerns

Cold weather will be coming. Northglenn has been working with surrounding municipalities and Adams County to provide a successful Severe Weather hotel voucher program.

Project Updates

The Winter Housing Program is still being explored as a resource for people experiencing homelessness in Northglenn.

Three residents experiencing homelessness received emergency housing vouchers. These residents are being notified so they can complete their applications and continue the process towards housing.

Anticipated Community Questions

Are cold weather hotel vouchers available?

SWAP will be active this year. This program is a partnership between the nonprofit, Almost Home, and Adams County. It is activated when temperatures drop below 32 degrees when it is actively snowing or raining and under 20 degrees when it is dry.
