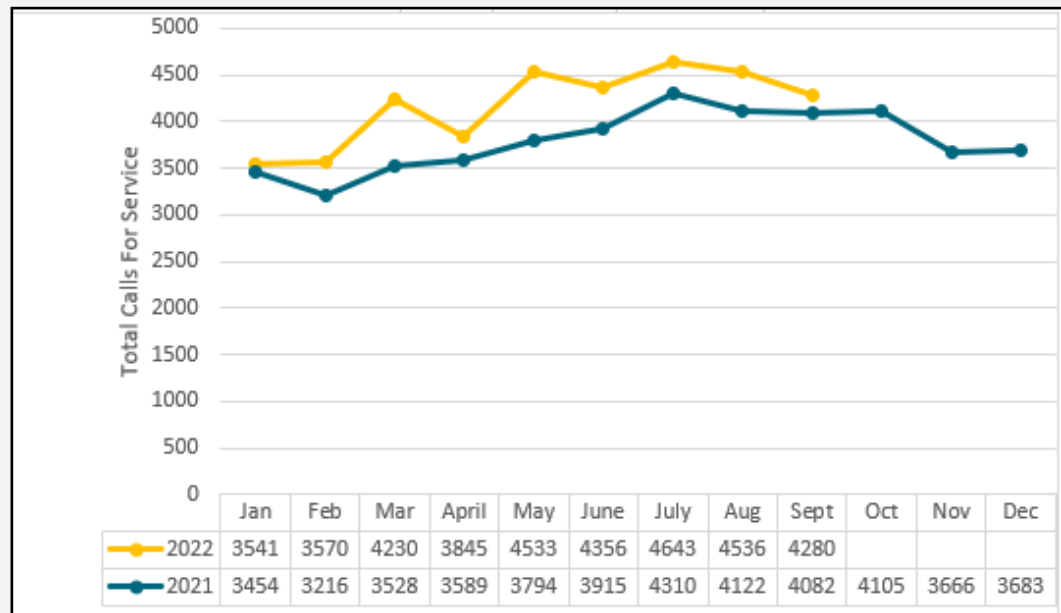

Crisis Response Unit Update:

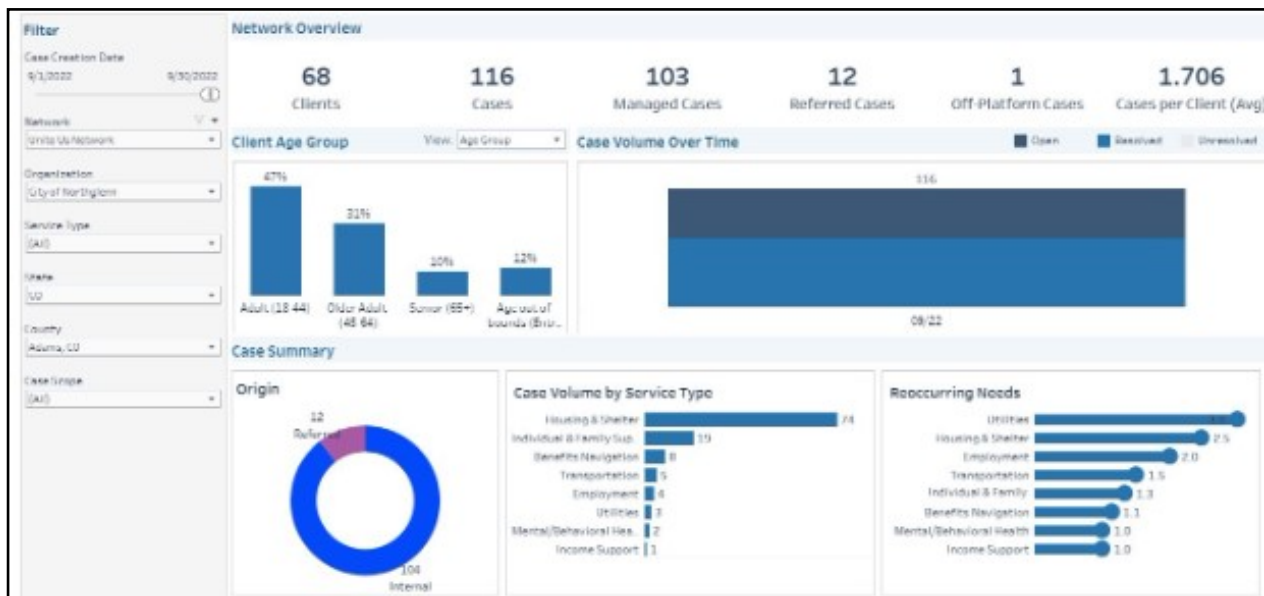
The Winter Housing Program has closed.
